### Quarterly Report #1 and final for HEERF- Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

All funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students were expended as of the 30 day report dated May 28, 2020 and reprinted below.

### HEERF 30 Day Fund Report- Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

1. On May 6<sup>th</sup>, 2020, California Christian College (the institution) signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement. The institution intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
2. The institution will receive from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students \$12,359.00, of which \$6,180.00 (half) is designated for student grants.
3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of submission (as of the 30-day Report) is \$6,182.00.
4. One hundred percent of California Christian College's students are eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
5. All of the institution's students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
6. All students were found to be eligible to receive this grant therefore the institution made the decision to divide the allocation equally to all students. Each student therefore will receive \$562.00 in CARES Act Grant.
7. All students were sent an email to confirm their mailing address for checks to be mailed. The student needed to reply to the email with their confirmation. The students were also notified in this email that although this grant should be used for costs related to their cost of attendance (food, housing, child care, course materials, etc.) it was not part of their Title IV financial aid package. This grant also would not need to be paid back nor would it impact their school bill.
8. All checks were mailed out on May 18, 2020.
